He is no stranger to building a variety of threat countermeasures. He previously directed counterintelligence operations in southwest Asia overseeing the work of Special Agents at 31 bases. Mr. Zatyko is the former co-chairman of the FBI's National Steering Committee Regional Computer Forensics Labs. He was also one of the first Board members for the National Media Exploitation Center. He is most noted in the cybersecurity community for initiating the National Cyber Investigative Joint Task Force. A former Senior Program Manager and Site Director at Raytheon BBN Technologies, he led multiple-million dollar projects involving over 40 scientists performing research and development in cybersecurity. BBN is best noted for inventing ARPANET, the precursor to the

Internet. He was previously employed by Booz Allen Hamilton as an Associate and subject matter expert in digital forensics, obtaining and executing contracts for the Department of Homeland Security National Cyber Security Division, National Security Agency Threat Operations Center, and Department of Defense Cyber Crime Center. Mr. Zatyko taught Intrusion Forensics for five years at Johns Hopkins University as an Adjunct Professor. He holds two Masters degrees from George Washington University and Air Command and Staff College. Mr. Zatyko is a native of Buffalo, NY and resides in Maryland.

Mr. Zatyko's first day at AIS, Inc. was May 16, 2011.
